





HOW TO GET TO BOLOGNA

The easiest way from/to <u>Airport of Bologna</u>: BLQ line airport/station (Marconi Express) The price of the one-way ticket is 11,00 € and it runs up to 8 times per hour from 5:40 am to midnight.

During the night hours the only connection is provided by **taxi**. Usually you can find a taxi queue just outside the airport (and in front of the central station) or you can call one in advance (for more info about taxi reservation check out <u>TaxiBologna</u> and <u>Cotabo</u>).

If your flight arrives to Milan/Rome, you can take the high speed train and arrive to Bologna in about 1 hour from Milan and about 2.5 hours from Rome. The high-speed train station of Bologna is located under the historical Central Train Station

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION



Bus

<u>TPER</u> is the company that carries out urban service in the city of Bologna and suburban and extra urban service in the territories of the province.

Tickets are available in all the TPER shops and in many newsstands all over the city. The ticket prices are the following:

- 1 HOUR TICKET: €1,50
- 1 DAY TICKET: €6,00 (it lasts 24h from the validation, unlimited rides)



CITY PASS: €14,00€ (10 rides of 75 minutes in the urban area)

In alternative, you can buy 1-hour bus ticket directly at the automatic machine placed on the bus, but the price for the ticket is higher (2,00€) and you will need coins (the machine does not give change).

You can buy a virtual ticket on most of the buses by paying with credit cards.

To check out the bus lines and schedules you can use the Moovit app or simply Google maps.



As for the transportation from/to the airport, the taxi service is available h24 all over the city.

🚔 Car Sharing

Bologna offers two alternatives of car sharing: Enjoy and Corrente (the electric car of TPER. Note that the service is not available in English).

If you'd like to use these services, in both cases we recommend you subscribe in advance by downloading the app and sign up because the account checks could also take a week or more.

Bike Sharing

If you are an active person and you like biking around the city, we definitely recommend you to try the bike sharing service offered by Ridemovi in the city of Bologna!

Bologna is the city of porticoes and the perfect way to visit its historical centre is by walking under its incredible arcades which forms an intricate and dense network crossing all the urban area.

TOURISTIC INFORMATION

Bologna offers plenty of touristic attractions and amazing spots to be discovered.

We recommend you to check out the website of <u>Bologna Welcome</u> to get all the touristic information you may need. If you prefer, you can also go directly to the main touristic office located at the very centre of the city in Piazza Maggiore.

If you're thinking to visit more than one museums and attraction on payment you can save some money by buying the <u>Bologna Welcome Card</u> which is the tourist card that helps you discover what's best in the city easily and cost effectively. There are more than one options of the card and you can buy it on-line or at tourist info points.

TOP 10 THINGS TO DO IN BOLOGNA

- 1. Get up to the 'Torre degli Asinelli'
- 2. Walk under the porticoes
- 3. Discover Piazza Maggiore and the S. Pertronio basilique
- 4. Try the local food: tortellini, crescentine, tagliatelle, ragù, mortadella and many others
- 5. Visit at least one of the many museums of the city (the National Picture Gallery of Bologna, the MAMbo, the Archiginnasio palace, etc.). Due to the Covid-19 situation it is necessary to book the visit to the museum you intend to go to
- 6. Discover the canals under the town
- 7. Have a walk inside the main hall of the Sala Borsa library
- **8.** Follow the pilgrimage route under the porticoes until the S. Luca Sanctuary (or take the S. Luca Express from the city center and get there more quickly).
- 9. Have a walk in the 'quadrilatero' streets and the ancient market
- 10. Discover S. Stefano square and the 7 churches

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
